

Broomball Equipment Required

- Shoes: all players wear shoes, not skates. There are special broomball shoes sold. These are recommended, but not required. Cost begins around \$70. If not purchasing broomball shoes, wear sneakers.
- Sticks: available through rink by rent or purchase.
- Helmets: required and available through rink by rent or purchase.
- Shin/knee pads: recommended.
- Elbow pads: recommended.
- Gloves: recommended.

Broomball can be played without padding and gloves. However, it is much more enjoyable and safe with this equipment. Broomball manufactures produce these products but it is not uncommon to see broomball players using padding from other sports such as hockey, volleyball, lacrosse, and soccer.

-Goalie Equipment: Broomball goalies typically wear more equipment than players. Where equipment is recommended for players, it is required for goalies. Goalies typically use a hockey blocker to hold their stick. The other hand typically wears some sort of padded glove, most often a soccer goalie glove. Hockey shin pads, hockey pants, and a hockey chest/arm protector are the norm. This equipment will be provided by the rink for each game. Equipment must be returned after each game.
