## January 2012 Hockey Classes!



Learn hockey skating fundamentals that lead to future game play, meet new friends and participate in the triad's most unique sport!

### Special Winter Promotion:

Enroll by December 19th and enjoy the \$10 early registration discount PLUS receive a second LTS Class Card with 8 complimentary public session admissions! This complimentary Class Card will be available for use as of 12/23 so skaters may practice during winter break. The Class Card that is regularly given with tuition will be available on the first class day—either January 3rd or January 7th.



## Student Benefits:

- ◆ 30 minute lesson once a week on Tuesdays (January 3rd through February 21st) OR Saturdays (January 7th through February 25th).
- ◆ **Two** make-up class opportunities per semester. **Make-up classes may not be taken on the following dates: 1/3, 1/7, 2/14, 2/18, 2/21 & 2/25.**
- ◆ Free skate rental for class — please request hockey skates.
- ◆ Ice House Class Card with 8 free public skate sessions, *skate rental not included*. \$3 public admission after all 8 sessions are used, *skate rental not included during weekend sessions*.
- ◆ \$0.25 soda drinks in eatery & 10% off regularly priced merchandise in the Pro Shop for student only with Class Card.
- ◆ US Figure Skating Basic Skills book with stickers (given once), Basic Skills member patch and year patch (given annually).
- ◆ Sports accident insurance.
- ◆ Class Card and benefits expire at end of enrolled term.
- ◆ Refunds (less \$20 administrative fee), for classes not taken, must be requested to Skating Director by week 3. LTS class card must be forfeited in conjunction with the refund request.

## Important Information:

- ◆ Skating Director reserves the right to combine or cancel classes based on attendance levels.
- ◆ If only one student attends a class, this student will receive a 20 minute lesson (instead of 30 minutes) as this is a private lesson. At the conclusion of the 20-minute lesson, the skater may remain on the ice in their designated class space and practice on their own.
- ◆ All first time enrollees ages 6 and up **must** register for Hockey 1. Skaters 15 and up should register for the Adult Hockey Workshop.
- ◆ Dress warmly in layers. Wear gloves or mittens and only 1 pair of *long* socks. Skates should fit snugly and be tied or fastened tightly from the toe up.
- ◆ Arrive at least 20 minutes early and, in order to be admitted to class, please present your Class Card each and every week at the Learn to Skate check-in table located in the front lobby. A Class Card, with intact make-up "punches," must be presented to the Learn to Skate table attendant in order to be admitted to make-up classes. **A maximum of 8 classes may be taken. Make-up classes may be taken week two through week five.**
- ◆ After presenting Class Card to Learn to Skate table attendant for class or make-up, please proceed to the skate rental counter to obtain **hockey** skates.
- ◆ Hockey equipment is **not** required, but safety helmets are strongly recommended for Hockey 1 students.
- ◆ All elements will be taught without a stick or puck as proper skating technique is the primary focus.
- ◆ Minimum enrollment required and classes may be combined at Skating Director's discretion.

### Hockey 1-4 for skaters 6-14 years old:

- ◆ **Hockey 1 Class** ~ new enrollees 6 years & up
- ◆ **Hockey 2 Class** ~ skaters who have passed Hockey 1
- ◆ **Hockey 3 Class** ~ skaters who have passed Hockey 2
- ◆ **Hockey 4 Class** ~ skaters who have passed Hockey 3

(New skaters 4 or 5 years old must register for the Snowplow 1 class—please see front desk for details.)

Tuesday classes meet from 5:45pm-6:15pm

Saturday classes meet from 10:45am-11:15am

### Adult Hockey Workshop for skaters 15 & up:

This class is offered on Saturdays from 11:15-11:45am.

### **There are no make-up classes for the Adult Hockey Workshop.**

The \$95 Adult Hockey Workshop tuition is reduced from standard fee to reflect that there are no make-up options for this course. Adult Hockey students may warm-up from 10:45-11:15am. Skaters must meet the minimum age requirement of 15 to enroll.
